The Voice of Faith

A couple of weeks ago, members of Faith Lutheran Church and several other congregations in Seward got together to worship, together! It is an annual event on a Thursday during the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, January 18-25 every year.

Every year we use a worship service that is made available so that people all over the world can worship together by using the same liturgy. This is just another way of intentionally engaging in unity with the Body of Christ. Each year the order of worship is written by churches from different parts of the world, giving it a different global flavor each year. I appreciate everyone who came and worshiped, but I would like to quote from parts of the service, both as a reminder for those who were there and as valuable perspective for those who were not.

"The resources for this year's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity have been prepared by the churches of the Caribbean. The history of Christianity in that region contains a paradox. On one hand, the Bible was used by colonizers as justification for the subjugation of the original inhabitants of these lands, and on the other hand, the Bible became a source of consolation and liberation for many who suffered at the hands of the colonizers.

Today, the Bible continues to be a source of consolation and liberation, inspiring the Christian community to address the conditions that currently undermine human dignity and quality of life. As the iron chains of enslavement fall from our hands, a new human bond of love and communion emerges in the human family, expressing the unity prayed for by our Christian communities."

Where we would normally have what we call "The Prayer of the Day," this service

had "Prayers of Reconciliation" using the "Kyrie" ("Kyrie eleison," which means "Lord have mercy) as a response:

"Let us call upon the mercy of God, confident in the saving power of God's Right Hand.

From structures that undermine human dignity and enforce new forms of enslavement, deliver us, O God. **Kyrie eleison**.

From decision and deeds that impose poverty, marginalization or discrimination on our brothers and sisters, deliver us, O God. **Kyrie eleison**.

From the fear and suspicion that separate us from each other and place limits on hope and healing, deliver us, O God. **Kyrie eleison**. The Lord is our strength and our might, and has become our salvation. May God, who has redeemed us, lead us into the abode of holiness. **Amen**."

The "Prayers of the People" included the following:

"God of love, you created us in your image and have redeemed us in Christ. Empower us to love our neighbor and to welcome the stranger. God of peace, you remain faithful to your covenant with us even when we wander from you, and in Christ you have reconciled us to yourself. Put a new spirit and a new heart within us, that we may reject violence, and instead be servants of your peace.

God, One in Three Persons, in Christ you have made us one with you and with one another. By the power and consolation of the Holy Spirit, free us from the self-centeredness, arrogance, and fear that prevents us from striving towards the full visible unity of your Church."

The "Sending" was called a "Commissioning," and was:

"L: Redeemed by the Right Hand of God, and united in the One Body of Christ, let us go forth in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Have a Heart

February: the month devoted to love. Stores are filled with heart-shaped boxes of candy and heart-shaped cards and vases of flowers with heart-shaped gift tags. All this is available for the consumer so that he can find the appropriate expression of his devotion to his loved one. If that expression of love has been preceded by a year of thoughtful and loving words and deeds, it is welcomed and cherished by the recipient. If not, it is just an empty ritual, done out of duty rather than true devotion.

Our relationship to the Lord is similar. God, too, desires our sincere devotion, not empty lip service. "The Lord says: 'These people come near to me with their mouth and honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me' " (Isaiah 29:13).



Stewardship is serving, helping, giving, but love is the basis for stewardship. Without love, our good deeds are empty and without merit. The first act of true stewardship is to "love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength" (Deuteronomy 6:5). Jesus called this the most important commandment (Mark 12:29, 30). With that love for the Lord in us, we are enabled to be good stewards. Then we can do acts of good stewardship, acts of true devotion. We are enabled to . . .

- "Give generously to him and do so without a grudging heart" (Deuteronomy 15:10).
- "Carefully observe [his decrees and laws] with all your heart and with all your soul" (Deuteronomy 26:16).
- "Share with God's people who are in need. Practice hospitality" (Romans 12:13).
- "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men" (Colossians 3:23).
